
## **Good News for You**


It was very good news when Kristin's family learned about Maggie. What's some really good news that you have received? Can you think of a word or two that describes how you felt when you heard it?

#### Was Jesus Real?

Some people think Jesus never existed. After all, nobody can prove that He actually did exist, right? True. But that doesn't mean He didn't exist. Nobody can prove Abraham Lincoln or Anne Frank or Martin Luther King Jr. or your great-great grandmother existed either—we have to rely on their written and/or spoken words, people who knew them, photographs, and other evidence.

It's important to understand the difference between proof and evidence. There is no proof, such as His skeleton, that Jesus existed, but there's plenty of evidence, including

eyewitnesses to Jesus' life and ministry.

Jesus' own words in the Bible and whether or not they work in real life.



Archaeological discoveries that support the Bible's story.

Ancient historians, politicians, and other writers who mention Jesus.

You can recall this main idea by memorizing the acronym W.O.E. (English). This stands for "Weight of Evidence," which simply means which way the "scales" tip when all the evidence is placed on them. In Jesus' case, the scales tip heavily in His favor.



Many experts believe this is the actual ossuary, or "bone box," containing the bones of Caiaphas, the GIHH RESTIP who was opposed to Jesus and later involved in His trial. (See John 11:49-53 and Matthew 26:57.) The writing on the box says "Joseph, son of Caiaphas" in a Bible-times language. The remains of six people were found in the box, including those of a man about 60-years-old—probably Caiaphas himself.

He died in AD 31. That means Christians have been sharing the gospel for just about 2000 years. Sometimes the gospel spread rapidly, but at other times Satan made it very hard for people to share the good news. But the gospel survived! Now the first angel is reminding us that everything in the three angels' messages is built on the timeless truth that Jesus took our place and died for our sins. This angel is making a final push for us to "preach," or share, that life-changing message one last time with the world.

The three angels' messages tell us (reveal) some crucial things that need to happen before Jesus comes back to take His followers to heaven. Thanks to Jesus and the book of Revelation, how to be ready is no mystery.
