COULD I reserve two seats for Sunday?" "Have just received your invitation card for . . ." "I want to book ten seats for Saturday, 3 p.m." "Just heard about your picture programme, 'Dead Men Don't Tell Stories,' or something like that. Could I reserve four seats?" These and thousands of other requests inundated five telephone lines twelve hours a day for several days prior to the presentation for the first time in London by Pastor J. F. Coltheart of "Dead Men Do Tell Tales."

"Ticket holders to the right; non-ticket holders queue on the left, please." "Let them come out first, please." The stentorian voices of the men on the door echoed in the foyer above the buzz of continual conversation as thousands going out made room for thousands coming in.

Pastor Coltheart, his wife, and family arrived in England during June of this year. Within a week

he was fully involved in preparations for evangelistic programme commencing in September. The largest phase of preparatory work was advertising—no easy task in London on financial terms. With unfailing zeal comparative prices were mulled over, printers selected, and within weeks 100,000 invitation cards and handbills ready for distribution. Then began the time-consuming task of addressing the envelopes. An invaluable and long-remembered help was willingly given by members of the Central London Greater London churches. A great contribution made by the office personnel of the South England Conference. Pastor Coltheart and the evangelistic team gives sincere thanks to all who contributed in this enormous task.

Along with the preparation of this material 400 advertising boards were made which bore

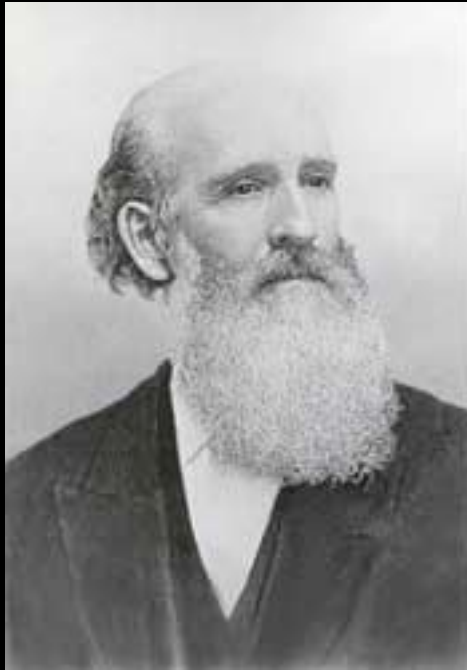

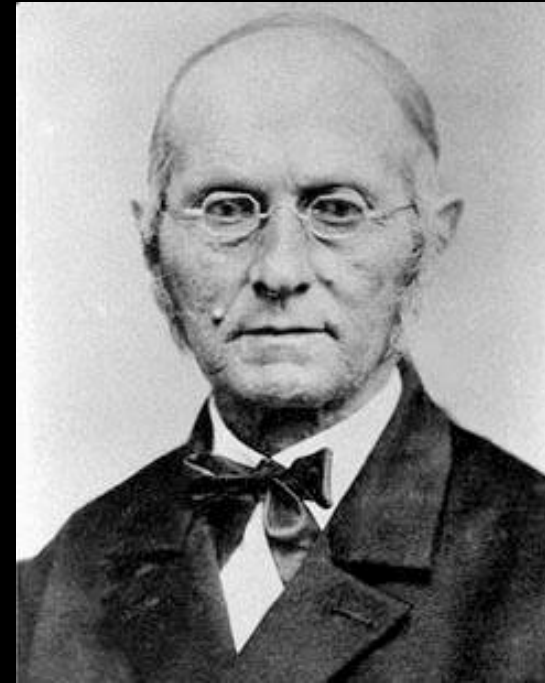
